

April 17, 2018
Regular Meeting

The Deuel County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday April 17 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commission Room of the Courthouse with Chairman DeJong presiding. Those present were Commissioners DeJong, Dumke, Jaeger, Rhody and Pederson. Also present was Auditor Pam Lynde. The meeting opened with prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Agenda 1) Dumke moved, seconded by Rhody to approve the agenda as presented. All voted yes and the motion carried.

APPOINTMENTS

9:05 Jamie Hintz Highway Superintendent

Hintz discussed several highway related issues with the Commissioners. Hintz said that Dennis Norton, Assistant Highway Superintendent, will be retiring June 20 and he recommended that Jamie Broksieck be promoted to the position of Assistant Highway Superintendent as of June 20. 2) Jaeger moved, seconded by Pederson to promote Jamie Broksieck to position of Assistant Highway Superintendent as of June 20. All voted yes and motion carried. Hintz said because of the promotion of Broksieck he would need to hire a blade operator for the Bemis shop. 3) Dumke moved, seconded by Rhody to advertise for a blade operator for the Bemis Shop. All voted yes and the motion carried.

Hintz also requested that a person be hired to do a county wide culvert data collection inventory. 4) Rhody moved, seconded by Jaeger to advertise for a part time summer position to do a culvert inventory in Deuel County. All voted yes and motion carried.

Hintz presented a work order from Banner Associates for bridge inspections. The County has 41 bridges and half of them will be inspected this year. 5) Rhody moved, seconded by Pederson to approve and sign work order B1-18-18 BR NBIS (36) maximum limiting amount \$10,433.19 completion date 1-1-19 with fixed fee of \$1317.38 with Banner Associates to perform bridge inspections in 2018. All voted yes and motion carried. Hintz talked about dust control and the leak detection system at the highway shop.

10:00 Trailblazers Snowmobile Club-Street Dane in Gary July 3

Marty Grabow, on behalf of the Gary Snowmobile Club, met with the Commissioners to discuss the possibility of holding a street dance on the main street in Gary, which is a county road, and closing a portion of the road during the dance. He said they have approval from the city for the dance but need the approval of the county to close the highway. He said the hours of the dance will be from 8:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. on July 3. 7) Dumke moved, seconded by Jaeger to close off portion of county highway #310 running east and west through City of Gary for street dance between 8:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. on July 3. All voted yes and the motion carried.

10:15 Community Health Nurse Tammy Baer Quarterly Report

Baer met with the Commissioners and gave them a quarterly update of the Community Health Nurse Office activities. The Community Health Nurse contract will be out and up for renewal in May. Baer stated the flu numbers have been higher than normal, seeing a lot of influenza B. Baer said the WIC case load is up and down; WIC offers healthy foods and nutrition tips along with guidance for nursing moms and introduce moms to a network of experts and peers. Baer stated she attended the Public Health Alliance meeting in Chamberlain also the Sioux Falls symposium where she presented on the subject of hepatitis A, a liver disease; encouraged the increase of vaccinations; immunization registry in SD contacting parents and schools to see that more children get immunized.

10:30 Public Hearing/First Reading on Request of Engelstad Farms to Rezone from Ag to Commercial Portion of Land in Section 24 of Scandinavia Township

A public hearing was held upon the request/petition of Engelstad Farms to issue a change in zoning classification for property that is described as: Engelstad Farms Bins Site Second Addition in the NW1/4 of 24-113-48 from Agricultural to Commercial. The petition and request were heard by the Deuel County Zoning Board and they recommended to the Commissioners that the above described property be rezoned to Commercial. No one was present at the hearing. The first reading of Ordinance B2004-01-25A was then held. The second reading will be held at the next regular meeting on May 1 at 10:30 a.m.

11:00 Drainage Board-Keith Goens

8) Jaeger moved, seconded by Rhody to adjourn as County Commission and reconvene as the Drainage Board. All voted yes and the motion carried. Keith Goens postponed his appointment to a later date as he didn't have all the paperwork completed.

11:15 Drainage Board-LeRoy Sonnenburg

LeRoy Sonnenburg presented an application to drain on the NE1/4 of 25-114-50 with the water flowing to the north with the outlet on his pasture and eventually going into a creek. The proposed length of the drain will be 1100 feet using four and six inch tile. He had the sign offs of adjoining landowners and the wetland determination on the

property. 9) Dumke moved, seconded by Rhody to approve and issue Drainage Permit #D18-02 to LeRoy Sonnenburg on the above described property. All voted yes and the motion carried.

11:30 Drainage Board-Joe Uckert

Joe Uckert presented an application to drain on the SW1/4 of 34-116-49 with the water flowing to the southwest into a creek and pasture. He had the sign offs of adjoining landowner and the wetland determination on the property. 10) Rhody moved, seconded by Jaeger to approve and issue Drainage Permit #D18-03 to Joe Uckert on the above described property. All voted yes and the motion carried. 11) Dumke moved, seconded by Pederson to adjourn as the Drainage Board and reconvene as County Commission. All voted yes and motion carried.
