September 19, 2023 Regular Meeting

The Deuel County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, September 19 at 9:00 A.M. in the Commission Room of the Courthouse with Chairperson Homan presiding. Those present were Commissioners Steve Rhody (via phone), Scott Fieber, Judith Homan, Jay Grabow and Harry Mewherter. Also present was Deputy Auditor Pam Lynde. The meeting opened with prayer and the pledge of allegiance. 1) Mewherter moved, seconded by Fieber to approve the agenda as presented. All voted yes and the motion carried.

APPOINTMENTS

9:00 Assistant Highway Superintendent-Marty Brown

Brown presented a right of way application from the City of Clear Lake to place a sign, Ulven Park, on County Roads going east of state highways 15 and 22 to Ulven Park. 2) Grabow moved, seconded by Fieber to approve and sign the right of way easement for City of Clear Lake to place a sign on County Highways with Hwy Dept. approving the placement of signs when put in. All voted yes and motion carried. 3) Mewherter moved, seconded by Rhody to declare as surplus Coats tire machine, clean burn waste oil furnace, bagger for cab and snow blower attachments for 445 JD mower, attachments only. All voted yes and motion carried. Discussion was held on the four-door half ton pickup and what should be done with it.

9:30 Sheriff/EM Director Cory Borg-Adopt Hazmat Plan

EM Director Cory Borg presented the Hazmat Plan for Deuel County. 4) Mewherter moved, seconded by Fieber to adopt the HAZMAT Plan of the Deuel County LEPC as the official document for emergency operations concerning hazardous material responses. All voted yes and motion carried. 5) Rhody moved, seconded by Grabow to pay for alpha training and tactics for body armor, helmet and plates through Homeland Security grant funds (no match required) in the amount of \$4152.85. All voted yes and motion carried. 6) Grabow moved, seconded by Mewherter to approve the purchase of six Dell laptop computers for patrol cars with Homeland Security Grant funds in the amount of \$17279.28 (no match required). All voted yes and motion carried. Both grants were applied for and approved in January of 23.

10:00 Public Hearing on 5 Year Highway Road and Bridge Improvement Plan

The Five-Year County Highway and Bridge Improvement Plan was presented and discussed. The Plan includes a bridge inventory list and a project needs list. It also includes a revenue source table, sufficiency rating map, surface type and average daily traffic and bridge location map, rating map and the five-year project location map. The plan is a short-range planning tool that will be developed and updated annually based on needs and identified Deuel County transportation policies. A township citizen attended the hearing and discussion was held on the plan. The plan, with any suggested changes will be adopted at the October 3 meeting. The plan hasn't changed a whole lot from the prior year's plan. Counties need to place a portion of their own funding into projects or they won't be considered. The plan places bridges on high priority so they are eligible for funding.

10:15 4-H Advisor Deb Lessman-Repairs at Fairgrounds

Lessman talked to the Commissioners about several areas at the Fairgrounds that need repairing. She said the pens were repaired this year as well as new bleachers were

purchased and installed. She said additional repairs needed in 2024 are upgrade to the exterior fence; lot of polls are broken and have been there 20 plus years; service center needs vinal strip around the bottom of the floor after redoing the floor covering last year; Service Center will be winterized by Nov. 1. She also said the hydrant and pipes near swine barn need repair; painting is in the 24 budget. Sept. is the end of the 4-H year and Lessman said she will present a report at a future meeting of the 4-H activities for 22-23.

10:30 State's Attorney Craig Evenson

Evenson spoke to the Commissioner about open meeting laws. If three members are present at a meeting it is considered a quorum; If any public body, county, city, township, school have a quorum present that meeting needs an agenda posted and publication of minutes. Evenson said the county sovereign powers are wide range because of funding and budget items and said that any entity that exercises sovereign power is subject to the opening meeting laws.

11:00 Sarah Salzer Good Samaritan Revitalization Committee

Salzer was present to discuss the Good Samaritan property and just wanted the Commissioners to be aware of the discussions that have taken place on options for the building.
