

June 19, 2018
Regular Meeting

The Deuel County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday June 19 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commission Room of the Courthouse with Chairman DeJong presiding. Those present were Commissioners DeJong, Dumke, Jaeger, Rhody and Pederson. Also present was Auditor Pam Lynde. The meeting opened with prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Agenda 1) Dumke moved, seconded by Jaeger to approve the agenda as presented. All voted yes and the motion carried.

APPOINTMENTS

9:05 Jamie Hintz Highway Superintendent

Hintz discussed several highway related issues with the Commissioners. The County has received information concerning the 2019 (BIG Grant) Bridge Improvement Plan process, which will be due to the SD DOT by Oct. 15. A project needs list and projected revenue source table will need to be completed along with a five year programmed project list. Project location maps will be developed. A public hearing on the projected improvements will be held in September. Hintz talked about several bridges in need of repair and the type, size and location of the bridges. Hintz said it is possible that a couple of these could be placed in the program (BIG) quite quickly.

2) Jaeger moved, seconded by Pederson to hire Jamie Araiza blade operator at 15.50 hr. as of June 20 with .50 hr. raise after six months. All voted yes and motion carried.

Hintz talked about the Community Access Grant Program through the SD DOT.

9:30 Paul Brandt-Clean Up Area by Horse Arena

Brandt met with the Commissioners and said a group would like to clean up the area near the horse arena where Deuel School practices football. East side of baseball fence area trees have grown out into the practice field. He requested cleaning out the area of trees and debris so they would have more area to practice. 3) Jaeger moved, seconded by Dumke to allow Brandt and others to clean the area west of the horse arena so area can be utilized by school for football practices. Deuel School has a 99 year lease with the County for area where football/track stadium is located. All voted yes and motion carried.

11:00 Drainage Board-Wayne TeKrony/Henry TeKrony

4) Rhody moved, seconded by Jaeger to adjourn as County Commission and reconvene as the Drainage Board. All voted yes and the motion carried. Wayne TeKrony on behalf of landowner Henry TeKrony presented an application to drain on the NE1/4 of 18-115-50 with the water flowing to the south eventually into a stock damn. The proposed length of the drain will be 30000 feet using four to eight inch tile. He had the sign off of adjoining landowner and the wetland determination on the property. 5) Jaeger moved, seconded by Dumke to approve and issue Drainage Permit #D18-05 to Wayne TeKrony/Henry TeKrony on the above described property. All voted yes and the motion carried.

11:15 Drainage Board-Ben Kremer/Howard Hanson

Ben Kremer on behalf of landowner Howard Hanson presented an application to drain on the NE1/4 of 11-113-48 with the water flowing to the south in the SW1/4NE1/4

of 11-113-48 and flowing to the south in the SW1/4 of 11-113-48 into a natural drainway and creek. The proposed length of the drain will be 10000 feet using five and six inch tile. He had the wetland determination on the property but did not have all sign offs for the project. 6) Jaeger moved, seconded by Rhody table action on the permit application of Ben Kremer/Howard Hanson until all signatures are received from adjoining landowners. All voted yes and the motion carried. 7) Dumke moved, seconded by Rhody to adjourn as the Drainage Board and reconvene as County Commission. All voted yes and motion carried.

There was no change in the count from the June 5, 2018 Primary.


