

July 6, 2021
Regular Meeting

The Deuel County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, July 6th at 9:00 a.m. in the Commission Room of the Courthouse with Chairman DeJong presiding. Those present were Commissioners DeJong, Jaeger, Rhody, Kreutner and Homan as well as Auditor Korth and members of the public. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

1) Rhody moved, seconded by Homan to approve the agenda as presented. All voted yes and the motion carried.

Approval of Minutes:

2) Jaeger moved, seconded by Kreutner to approve the minutes of the regular meetings June 1st and June 15th and special meeting June 22nd. All voted yes and the motion carried.

APPOINTMENTS

9:00 Highway Superintendent Jamie Broksieck

Broksieck met with the Commissioners to discuss highway related issues. Interviews have been held for positions with the Deuel County Highway Department. 3) Kreutner moved, seconded by Rhody to hire Jacob Salanoa as a blade operator with a starting wage of \$17.76. Start date subject to Salanoa accepting the position. All voted yes and motion carried. 4) Rhody moved, seconded by DeJong to accept the resignation of Aaron Wipf at the Highway Department. All voted yes and motion carried. Personnel advertising will remain in place until all positions filled.

Broksieck discussed the overlay project on the Brandt Road near the state line (County Roads 314 and 516). He presented a project cost sheet for the construction cost which is in the 2021 budget. An exact quote will be presented in a future meeting for the project.

Borg reported that part-time Dispatch Sandy Koenecke has retired from the Sheriff's Office effective June 22, 2021. Koenecke has served Deuel County Sheriff's Department in some capacity for over 30 years. The Sheriff's Office recognized and thanked Koenecke for her service. 6) Kreutner moved, seconded by Homan to accept the resignation and full retirement of part-time dispatcher Sandra Koenecke. All voted yes and motion carried. 7) Rhody moved, seconded by DeJong to hire Rebecca Burns on an as needed basis part time dispatch in the Sheriff's Office at an hourly rate of \$15.20. All voted yes and motion carried. The Sheriff's Office hours have been changed to: Monday through Friday 8am to 5pm but closed for an hour over lunch.

9:45 Clear Lake City Library – Patti Ruby

Ruby approached the Board with a 2022 budget request for the City Library. She presented information and happenings with the Library in the past year. She stressed that many library card holders are outside of city limits. 30% of patrons reside outside of city limits and nearly all are from the County. The Clear Lake City Library is asking for \$2000.00 in staff support from the County for 2022. The Board thanked her for the presentation and her time and will consider the request at their budget meeting by end of month.

Gass updated the Commissioners on various items he has been working on related to his office.
